

Grade Level: Grade 2

Subject: Visual Arts

Objective:

- Students will create an artwork inspired by the story "Jungle Buddyz: A Race to Remember."

- Students will explore the concept of friendship, teamwork, and believing in oneself through art.

- Students will use various art materials and techniques to express their creativity.

Materials:

- Drawing paper
- Pencils
- Erasers
- Crayons
- Colored pencils
- Markers
- Watercolor paints
- Paintbrushes
- Water cups

- Construction paper or colored cardstock

Introduction:
