



Grade Level: Grade 2

Subject: Language

Objective:

- Students will be able to comprehend and retell the story "Jungle Buddyz: A Race to Remember".
- Students will reflect on the importance of believing in oneself and the support of friends.

Materials:

- Copy of the story "Jungle Buddyz: A Race to Remember"
- Whiteboard or chart paper
- Markers or chalk
- Create a discussion questions worksheet

Introduction:

1. Display the title of the story, "Jungle Buddyz: A Race to Remember", on the board.
2. Ask students if they have ever heard of the word "race" and what it means.
3. Discuss with students what they think the story might be about based on the title and any prior knowledge they have about jungles and animals.
4. Introduce the main characters of the story and briefly describe their personalities and strengths.

Story Comprehension:

1. Read the story "Jungle Buddyz: A Race to Remember" aloud to the class.
2. While reading, pause at certain points to ask comprehension questions about the characters and events in the story.
3. Use the whiteboard or chart paper to list key points and characters as students answer the questions.

Discussion and Reflection:

1. After finishing the story, lead a class discussion about the message or lesson that the story conveys.
2. Ask students to reflect on the challenges Scooter faced and how his friends supported him.
3. Discuss the importance of believing in oneself and the role of supportive friends in achieving goals.

Conclusion:

1. Summarize the key points of the story and the discussion.
2. Ask students to share one thing they learned from the story or one way they can support their friends like the Jungle Buddyz did.

Extension Activity:

1. Hand out the discussion questions worksheet to each student.
2. Have students work independently or in pairs to answer the questions based on their understanding of the story.
3. After completing the worksheet, encourage students to share their answers with the class or in small groups.
